Brockton, MA – Come to your senses at Fuller Craft Museum’s **[SENSE]ation Day** community celebration on Monday, February 19, 2007 from 12:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. Kids of all ages will enjoy making art in hands-on workshops, see artist demonstrations and participate in interactive fairy tales with Imagine That! Productions.

There’s nothing more interactive than a show where the audience becomes the act! In Sarah Salerno Thomas’ production of *The Singing, Ringing Tree* the audience is invited to take part in acting out the story. Adapted from a fairy tale about the transforming power of love, all 12 characters—ranging from panthers to princes to pigs—are portrayed by children from the audience. The production features a collection of large papier-mache masks created by award-winning artist Ruth Fledermaus. Ms. Salerno-Thomas has performed widely throughout New England – from the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston to the Johnson Museum of Art at Cornell University – since founding Imagine That! Productions in 1996 in Boston. Show times are at 12:30 p.m., 2:00 p.m., and 3:30 p.m.

Families can also participate in ongoing demonstrations and art activities throughout the day. Visitors can create a fanciful mask, learn the Japanese art of paper dyeing, watch candy making demonstrations by the owners of Gowell’s Candy (and take a taste, too!), enjoy yummy treats at the Girl Scout bake sale, and groove to the sounds of local high-school jazz band, Hot Strawberries! Docents will also be on hand to talk to parents and children about the artwork currently on exhibit
