Tricks of the Trade: Illusions in Craft-Based Media highlights the aesthetic and technical wonders of contemporary trompe l'oeil masterworks. Trompe l'oeil (meaning "fools the eye" in French) is a hyper-realistic style of art in which viewer perceptions and the artists' materials are never what they seem. In the works featured here, clay imitates wood and metal, two- and three-dimensionality becomes muddled, and opaque matter appears impossibly translucent. The very nature of trompe l'oeil incites additional questions and prompts a second look. While Tricks of the Trade presents some of the finest technical achievements in contemporary craft, many of the exhibited works boldly explore commentary on a vast array of topics, including environmentalism, consumerism, artistic tradition, personal experiences, and other subjects. By taking a fresh and inquisitive look at common materials and motifs, viewers may begin to perceive themselves in a different light as well, considering aspects of their own lives and questioning if everything is truly what it appears to be.

Tricks of the Trade is a timely exhibition, one that highlights the treasures of the handmade, while also examining the things we create, utilize, and value. As a result of the juxtaposition between the artificial and the real, viewers gain of deeper understanding of creation in both the human hand and the natural world.
